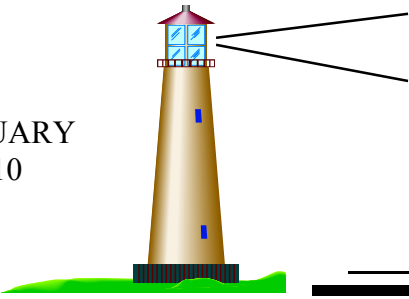

Join us for a Lenten Journey to the Mountainside with Jesus; to worship Him and learn from His teachings. We will focus on the various parts of the Sermon on the Mount (The Beatitudes, Fulfillment of the Law, Judgment and Righteousness, Discipleship Practices, and more).

We will gather in the Chapel to sing songs, share prayer, explore scripture, and practice some faith applications we learn from the Sermon on the Mount. Make this gathering a part of your Lenten Journey this year, as we seek to follow in the Ways of Jesus. The Wednesday Gatherings begin February 24th and we will gather each Wednesday through March 24th.

FROM OUR PASTOR

"Mountaintop Experiences" *A Journey for Lent*

I don't know how many of you have had the opportunity to journey up a "high mountain" to take in the wonder of God's creation from that type of spectacular view. Last year I had several opportunities to have some "mountaintop experiences". Each experience had a link with a spiritual retreat or conference I was attending. When I visited with my cousin in Colorado last Summer, I was preparing to attend the Reforming Pastors' Conference. Not only did I have a grand view from his home in Pine, Colorado, (around 9,000 feet), but also had the opportunity to visit Pike's Peak. I had never seen the drifting movement of clouds beneath me like that, although I had often flown above them. Later in the Fall, I was at the foot of the Black Mountains in North Carolina to attend a CREDO conference at Lake Logan. While there, I had several "spiritual encounters" with the Lord. Even as I write this article for the February Tower Light, I am watching a slow snowfall in the Laurel Mountains, at the home of friends in Hidden Valley, where I have retreated to prepare for the coming Season of Lent.

Jesus often retreated to a high place to converse with his Father, God. Feeling drained from healing or teaching, He would be "re-energized" and could move on to do more teaching and healing. It was upon a mountain that He was transfigured. It was on a mount that He was crucified. It was atop a mountain that He ascended. As the season of Lent unfolds in the middle of February, I invite you to "go up" a few mountains with me. We are going to journey up several mountains that have appeared in scripture and join others who have encountered God in a "high place".

We will visit the Mount of Bethel, Mount Horeb, Mount Carmel, and other "high points" along the way to Mount Calvary. With each encounter we will discover what the people learned about their relationship with God having visited the "mountaintop". We will join Abraham, Moses, Jacob, Elijah, and other prophets, along with the disciples who ventured with Jesus on occasion to the "mountain" to hear God and His instruction for their lives. It is my hope that through each discovery we will learn more about our own journey of faith and energize our souls for doing the work of the Kingdom of Jesus Christ.

People often refer to a special or exciting experience as being a "mountaintop experience." There is usually some form of extra feeling of "spiritual movement", beyond the ordinary or what was expected to happen. It is often a moment that marked either a beginning or a culmination of a journey that was special to the person. I hope to hear about some of our members' "mountaintop experiences" as we converse about these "God moments" in the lives of people in scripture and in our lives.

Join in worship each Sunday in February as we prepare and begin our journey into the mountains to be with God:

- ◆ February 7th - Service of Confession and Sacrament of Communion
- ◆ February 14th - Service of Wholeness and Healing
- ◆ February 17th - Ash Wednesday: Jesus prepares to move to Mount Calvary.
- ◆ On Wednesday, February 24th we will begin 5 Wednesdays focusing on the Sermon on the Mount.

Throughout Lent I will also be presenting a Wednesday opportunity to be in Prayer with the Pastor, as we gather in various places to offer prayer for what is on our minds and hearts, including prayer for others and the world. One of the opportunities will take us up to Mount Washington to pray for the City of Pittsburgh and the surrounding region. (Look for details inside this issue of the Tower Light).

Lent is intended to be a time for spiritual pilgrimages for the people of God. It is a time to retreat unto the Lord, to go apart from all other things that demand our attention and "come apart for a time to be with the Lord, before you come apart". I hope you will make an effort to walk with others in faith throughout the upcoming month and full season of Lent which ends on Easter Sunday, April 4th.

I hope to see you along the way!

Five for Five

With the receipt of the Joy Offering at Christmas we became a "Five for Five" congregation in 2009, as we have been for several years. Our congregation received and disbursed mission funds to all Five extensions of Mission Funding through the Presbyterian Church U.S.A. In 2009 we disbursed mission dollars to the Basic Mission Support for Mission Personnel, sent in collected funds for One Great Hour of Sharing (See appeal in this issue of Tower Light), the Pentecost Offering (Youth Ministry & Mission Projects), Peacemaking Offering (Resources and Training for Conflict Situations), and the Joy Offering (Extra support for Retired Ministers and Mission Workers and their families & Ethnic Schools & Colleges). The final total for this year's Peacemaking Offering was \$1,064 and the Joy Offering \$2,044. In addition to these efforts, the congregation also contributed \$3,642 to match a \$2,000 matching grant for personal assistance for families and neighbors related to our congregation.

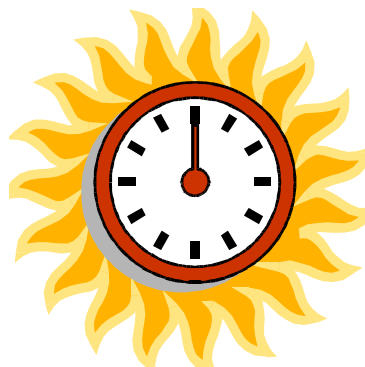

“To My Wallace Memorial Family”

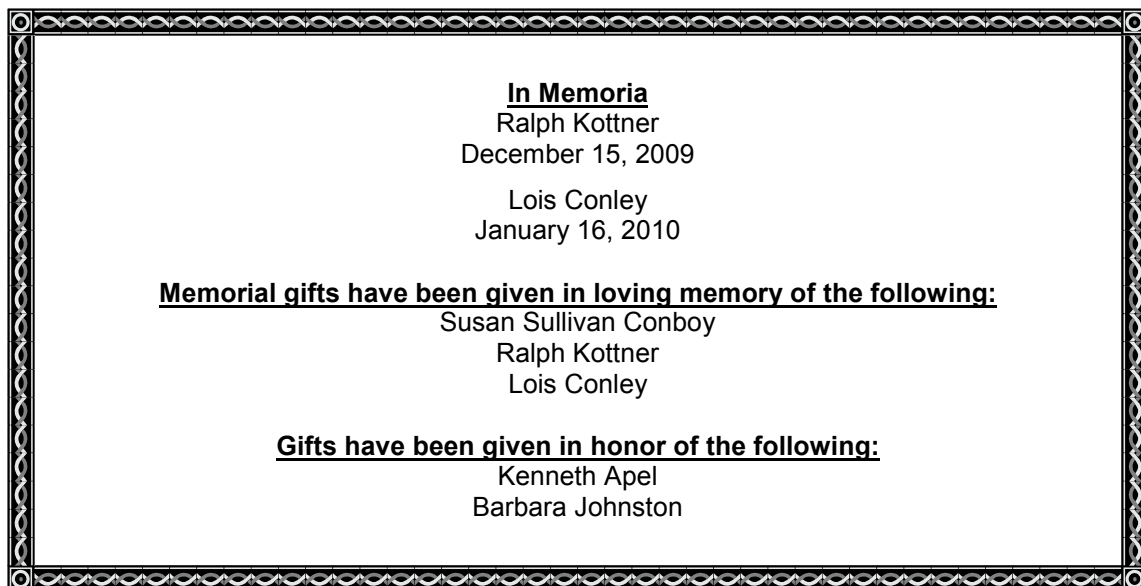
