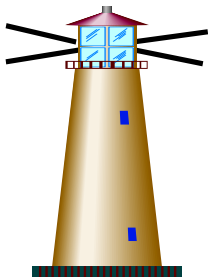

The Blessing of Presence

Throughout the month of October we celebrated 80 years of ministry and mission for the Kingdom of Jesus Christ. In actuality though, that ministry has been unfolding for many years prior to the founding of Wallace Memorial Presbyterian Church. In my exploration of the archives I also discovered how the Board of American Missions purchased the property for our church facilities for \$4,000 in November of 1928. The Board of American Missions then donated \$10,000 and loaned \$6,000 to enable the construction of the original sanctuary building for \$25,000. The monies came from a fund established by the sale of the Eighth Presbyterian Church in Pittsburgh in 1924 where the Dr. James M. Wallace was the beloved pastor for thirty-three years. This established a presence for the church building as a mission station for ministry and mission in the Green Tree area. However, the presence of a building does not assure the presence of God.

During the month of November we will consider how we provide a presence for God in the communities we extend ourselves to as a provisional representation of the Body of Christ. I say provisional because we live our lives in temporary housing. "We have this treasure in earthen vessels, to show that this all-surpassing power comes from God and not from us. We always carry around in our body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be revealed in our body. For we who are alive are always being given over to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus may be revealed in our mortal body." (2 Corinthians 4:7, 10-11) We need the presence of the Lord with us in order to carry that presence into the world in His name. Hence, during the month of November we will be exploring and celebrating how we are "blessed to be a blessing."

In a variety of ways we will practice the presence of God and what benefit that brings us and to others through us. Brother Lawrence, a spiritual formation writer, was a humble cook who discovered the greatest secret of living in the Kingdom of God here on earth was the art of "practicing the presence of God in one single act that does not end." He learned that all the things we do in our daily routines, every activity, could enable us to experience communion with the Lord. We can do that by cultivating a deep presence of God in our souls and allowing God to reveal His blessed presence and make us a blessing for His Kingdom. In his writings, Brother Lawrence points out four blessings the soul receives to enable that presence to fill us and be manifest through us. The first blessing the soul receives from the practice of the presence of God is that its faith is livelier and more active everywhere in our lives. The soul receives this blessing by entering the presence of God and we most often experience that through our worship practices and other spiritual disciplines like prayer and scripture reading. The second blessing we receive is the strength of hope that emerges in our lives. Our hope increases and grows stronger as our faith explores the power of God's presence in all things, especially as we experience it through difficult times. Is it any wonder people tend to drift away from the church when all is well and are compelled to "get to church" when something "goes wrong" in the world or in their personal life? The third blessing for the soul is the glow of the fire of holy love. When we discover the soul is always with God, there is a sacred ardor and desire that emerges in our soul to seek God, Who is love! The fourth blessing of practicing the presence of God is that of becoming familiar with God and the multitude of ways we can experience His presence in our doing. Our lives become vessels that express love, praise, confidence, thanksgiving, offering, and intercession unto God. We truly become blessed to be a blessing.

We will develop this sense of presence in a variety of ways and several opportunities will be presented to everyone to practice presence to experience the blessing. It begins by surrendering over to the possibilities. Do you want to experience the blessing? Do you want to be blessed to be a blessing to others? Do you want your soul to become afire with the presence of God? Enter His presence this month through not only being in worship every Sunday leading up to Thanksgiving, but anticipate the presence that you can carry into the Advent and Christmas Season this year. We can discuss this "blessing" idea at a new opportunity to have Coffee and Conversation with the Pastor every Tuesday morning in November beginning November 9th, at 9:00 a.m. in the new Lounge area. Come by to chat about what is happening in your life, the world, and how we can share the presence with each other. You never know, perhaps some prayer may break out or a Bible may get opened up. Let's practice the presence by being present to each other and discover the benefits that can fill our soul to overflowing making Wallace a place where Christ is spoken, broken, poured out, and more to the glory of God. See you around the Kingdom this month.

OUR FIRST ANNIVERSARY OF LIQUID JUSTICE

It has been over one year that we as a congregation have switched our simple love of coffee to a gesture of a loving neighbor. Your Mission Committee and the Deacons offer this delicious opportunity to keep families together on their own land, to practice economic justice and to enjoy an excellent cup of coffee. The Café Justo Project is a faith-based initiative that addresses the root cause of migration – *economics*.

How does it work?

This Project is a cooperative consolidating all the functions of coffee growing together and keeping all related revenue in Mexico. Going beyond all other trade models, this is Fair Trade PLUS which is the first of its kind, paying farmers a greater amount of the fair price per pound, paying cooperative members health and retirement benefits, sharing profits investing them in community development programs and creating other jobs outside the agriculture sector through trickle-up economics. Just Coffee (or Café Justo in Spanish) is delicious all-natural, certified organic estate-grown coffee that is roasted to order.

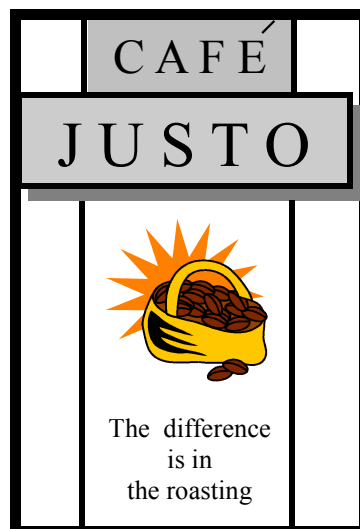
What are the benefits?

The financial benefits of Café Justo are significant when compared to Fair Trade coffee or local purchases. For this reason, we are able to see the impact this business has on migration. The value of this business to residents in the area of Salvador Urbina, Mexico, is clear. Our coffee purchases are having a direct and dramatic effect on this community. The cooperative members and community are putting aside their differences to provide an excellent, chemical-free, environmentally-friendly product and business that focuses on Just relationships!

The Tapestry

Creator and creation are one and the same. Weaver and Weaving are inextricably enmeshed. They are interchangeable. The Creator/Weaver creates and weaves everything into the fabric of the Weaver's self. Call it God, or Life, or Love, or Spirit, or Cosmos, or Eternity, or all of the above. It is One; it encompasses Everyone and Everything. We are all a part of it, woven into it—everything human being, every living creature, every plant, every rock, every mountain, sea, ice-cap, and desert. The Tapestry is alive and life-giving and it is beautiful.

True, there are places where the Tapestry is flawed. Large sections are marred by war, genocide, slavery, poverty, rampant disease, hatred, prejudice, anger and fear. Less noticeable flaws of self-interest, jealousy, greed, lack of caring, lack of compassion—no matter how small—still mar the beauty and integrity of the whole. The mind/spirit of the Weaver does not dwell on fault, guilt, judgment, punishment, or even reward. The Weaving yearns only for healing and wholeness of the fabric; for strengthening of the fibers, integration of their individual beauty into the glory of the whole Tapestry.

Each single fiber is vital to the Tapestry, each having its own color and texture, its own position and purpose; each is necessary to the whole. Throughout time, some threads have been more visible, for good or ill, and have had a greater effect on the image the Tapestry displays. Fibers that are less noticeable, for good or ill, nevertheless have their own effect on the beauty, strength and integrity of the Tapestry. As the weaving process continues, threads may become knotted or frayed or twisted. Then the Weaver reweaves a section to restore its strength and beauty. The Weaving works to heal itself, seeking only wholeness and renewal.

No single thread or fiber can discern or imagine the vastness or beauty or complexity of the Weaving, yet all the threads are connected. Each fiber affects every other fiber it touches, and all of those fibers affect the other fibers they touch—those beside them, those they cross, those above or beneath. Each thread has its weaknesses where it must be supported by others; each also has its strengths which add to the texture of the fabric.

When one goes through that experience we call physical death, that one is not removed from the Weaving. Rather, there is a healing of former flaws and absorption into the fabric of the Tapestry, adding to its foundation structure, color and texture. As new threads are woven in, around and over the basic fabric, the old threads are less visible, but no less a part of the Weaving. The older threads still show through in places and become a more subtle part of the image. They still serve to support the living, growing Tapestry.

In the physical world, that which dies decays, disintegrates, and is absorbed into the earth, its elements soon to be transformed into new forms of life. In the spiritual realm, in similar—but not identical—fashion, there is a transformation from one kind of life to another. That which has gone through transformation supports that which has not yet been transformed. My perception of God, then, is not of One at a distance, watching over us, but One beneath, who upholds us, along with the whole of creation, and is the foundation of all that is. Although I do not understand how this has come about, the truth that is most significant in my life is this:

I am woven into God—and so into everything else in all creation—we are all connected; we are all of one fabric. No matter what happens to me, or what I do, I am woven into God.
