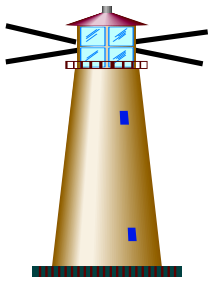

- We will be having some roof repairs done this month and you should see some new entry area mats and hallway runners before the Winter season begins.
- Keep watching for some "finishing touches" in the new Lounge. We have added a few pillows, lamps, and a few items are on order. There is a new Kuerig machine for use during week-days for those wishing to have a quick cup of coffee or tea. Stop by, relax, and enjoy our newest area for fellowship.
- The Wallace Nursery School currently has 85 children enrolled and engaged in a wide variety of developmental activities.

PRESBYTERIAN WORLD MISSION **THE PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH {USA}**

Currently 210 mission personnel serve with global partners in more than 50 countries to proclaim Christ's good news, empower vulnerable people, and work for reconciliation. Thousands of lives have been transformed through their faithful service. Each month we will acquaint you with some of these workers and share some messages of hope!

Rev. Catherine Day – Malawi – Kay, former pastor of Mt. Pisgah Presbyterian Church, is Chaplain of the Synod of Blantyre in Malawi {Africa}. She ministers to fellow clergy who often serve 4 large congregations. In addition, she prepares continuing education for clergy, and is the Administrator of the Chicoda Women's Centre.

Rev. Janet Guyer – South Africa – Janet worked with former staff member, Judy Menk, at East Liberty Presbyterian Church, and currently serves as a regional AIDS consultant for Southern Africa. She plans retreats for pastors and church workers who provide pastoral care for families affected by AIDS.

Carlton {Cobbie} Palm – Philippines – Cobbie, son of mission workers in the Philippines, returned under appointment in 1989 to be the Director of Spiritual Formation of the Divinity School at Silliman University {where the Humphreys served}, designing retreats and workshops for the Seminary community.

Some stories of hope...

"...Mujinga walked more than 160 miles so that her infant son, Kasawu, could receive life-saving surgery at Good Shepherd Hospital in the Democratic Republic of the Congo, where Dr. John Fletcher performs and teaches surgery. It is the only hospital in the region where the complex surgery needed to correct Hirschsprung's Disease, an illness of the large intestine, can be safely performed. *More important is the fact that along with the medical care, we provide a witness to the Gospel message of Christ's redeeming love,* says John, who serves in mission with his wife, Gwenda, an educator. The hospital is a ministry of the Presbyterian Community of Congo, a long time partner of the PC{USA}."

"...The massive earthquake that devastated Haiti's capital in January of 2010 sent a large number of survivors to the small Haitian community of Papaye. Searching for ways to sustain themselves, many are aided by mission worker, Mark Hare, an agronomist, whose expertise is helping people grow large quantities of food on small plots. Mark teaches sustainable agricultural techniques to small farmers."

What's Cookin'?

We have a wonderful facility to make mission happen! Lots of groups use the building, especially our kitchen...to make meals for the shelters, sandwiches for the homeless, bereavement lunches and numerous other services to our church and community.

To help us be efficient and healthy in our planning, we recommend the following:

- Leave no left-overs in the refrigerator. If the dish is intended for an event, mark the date and activity clearly. It is better to take your left-overs home than to see them "go bad" in the refrigerator!
- After an event, empty dishes can be placed on the counter. If a name is on the plate, all the better! If these are not retrieved in a reasonable length of time, they will most likely be given away.
- There is a mesh bag for soiled dish towels, etc. No one will be mad if you take them home, wash them, and return them! But alas, worry not...if you don't wash them, I will!
- Partly-used containers are a problem, i.e. creamer, cooking spray, salad dressings, etc. Check what we have and feel free to use it, unless it's designated. If you don't find something you need, let us know. Eventually the expiration date dictates that we need to discard things. So, take it home or we'll get rid of it!
- Wipe off the counters frequently. No matter how clean the kitchen, ants are always a problem.

We appreciate your faithful service and look forward to your suggestions about how we can be even better!
