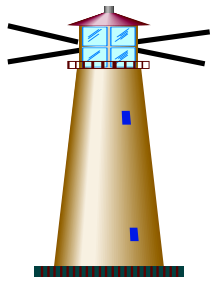

Each month we will highlight several Presbyterian mission workers whose faithful ministries are showing Christ to the world in very special and practical ways. This is how your mission money is used!

Mark Adams – Mexico – US Border

Since 1998 Mark Adams has served the Presbyterian Birder Ministry in Frontera de Cristo, a binational ministry of the PC(USA) and the National Presbyterian Church of Mexico in Douglas, AZ and Piedras Negras, Mexico. Frontera de Cristo is one of six such border ministries along the US-Mexico border.

Mark hosted the mission group that Wil Forrest was in last year!

Amy Davisson Galetzka – Thailand

Based in Chian Mai in northern Thailand, Amy coordinates a ministry among Burmese refugees. She assists with programs that facilitate ethnic unity and reconciliation among the ethnic peoples of Myanmar (formerly Burma) who now live in Thailand near the border with Myanmar. Wallace Church through the Mission Committee has an ongoing relationship with Amy and last year sent aid packets to the Free Burma Rangers for refugees from the military government of Burma.

Tim Wheeler and Gloria Wheeler – Honduras

Tim and Gloria serve with Heifer International. Tim is responsible for implementing, monitoring and evaluating Heifer programs in Honduras. He also facilitates training and evaluation workshops in other Central American countries. Gloria coordinates study tours and mission team visits from the US. Tim and Gloria have served in Honduras in various capacities for almost 30 years.

“A New Year and A New Birth”
“Behold, I make all things new.”
Jesus

With the emergence of the New Year there will be some emerging new births for our congregation! No, I am not talking about the births Terri and I are anticipating as grandparents in the New Year. Rather I am talking about the new birth of worship, fellowship, education, mission and stewardship that will unfold in the new year for the sake of the gospel of Jesus Christ through Wallace in 2011. Beginning on Sunday, January 2nd we will begin the new birth of worshipping together at Wallace during one Sunday Morning Worship Service at 10:15 a.m. each week. On Sunday, January 9th, we will begin our new full Sunday morning schedule with the Education Hour beginning at 9:00 a.m. (Chapel Chat @ 8:45 a.m.) with Morning Worship at 10:15 a.m. A time of Fellowship in the Lounge will follow the Morning Worship Service and you can always stop in the Lounge for coffee, tea, hot chocolate or other offered beverage prior to the Education Hour or the Worship Service.

The Session has also decided to renew the annual fiscal year to coincide with the calendar year. Beginning January 1st, a new budget for 2011 will be implemented with a few adjustments that will provide the financial support for our Ministry and Mission Services. Complete details will be shared at a Wallace Town Meeting on Sunday, January 30th following the morning worship service. Information about some new projects, events, programs, and staffing will be shared. Details about new mission projects will be shared along with an update on the existing mission programs we support.

These changes may make a few people stretch their comfort zone levels as we implement a new worship service pattern and financial support framework. Tom Davis and I have been shaping a New Worship Service that we believe reflects the current Wallace Family at Worship. There will be new elements to our worship experience blended with some elements that used to be part of the early service and the late services of past years. For instance, the Sacrament of Communion will now be celebrated on the 1st and 3rd Sundays of each month. New liturgy will be blended with traditional creeds and prayers while the music will reflect the variety of styles that will make use of musical gifts we have as a congregation to offer unto the Lord. The focus will be on providing a vibrant, authentic, and genuine worship service experience for God’s glory and our participation.

Please keep in mind that the primary goal of worship is to give glory and praise to God. God initiates worship with His creation in order to maintain a relationship with them. Acceptable worship never begins with human intuition or inventiveness but with divine action. Worship is a response. We worship as a way of keeping ourselves in harmony with God. In fact, failure to worship is sin.

The failure to worship is the essence of sin. Scripture is filled with exhortations to worship God as well as warnings regarding our failure to worship the source of all. “The wrath of God is being revealed from heaven against all the godlessness and wickedness of men who suppress the truth by their wickedness, since what may be known about God is plain to them. For since the creation of the world God’s invisible qualities – His eternal power and divine nature – have been clearly seen, being understood from what has been made, so that men are without excuse.” (Romans 1: 18-20) We should not suppress our worship but use our worship to submit to God’s authority over all things, confess His worthiness, and honor His majesty. Worship matters! We worship so that we can be intimate with the Triune God.

The doctrine of the Trinity lies at the heart of a truly Christian theology of worship. Each Person of the Godhead plays a significant role in establishing worship appropriate to the new covenant era of the church. Trinitarian themes and creative ways to honor Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is an important part of taking the gospel message seriously.

Another goal of worship should be to develop our sense of community. That is one of our hopes in going to one worship service for a time. The one unmistakable factor urged in scripture about worshipping in an authentically New Testament style is the emphasis on community. The early church functioned corporately, not individually. It was an assembly, a gathering of believers, no matter what style or location was chosen. The apostle Paul wrote time and time again that the primary purpose of Christian assembly is the edification of the church. So the real question in evaluating the effectiveness of worship is not “Did I enjoy that?” but “Did that build up the church?” Joining the corporate worship of the body of Christ requires that we allow - the good of the body - to supercede our personal preferences.

All of us should be willing to make some adjustments to our worship comfort levels in the weeks ahead. You may arrive to find that your pew is occupied by someone you haven't met yet or used to sit there in the other worship service time. How you greet that individual in the seat or approaching the seat you are in speaks about the hospitality of your heart. We should be willing to sing a hymn or song that isn't our “personal” favorite because it may be the one that inspires the soul in the pew next to you or the new seeker who is coming to Wallace for the first time. We must always keep in mind that worship is about what God has in mind for us, rather than what we have in mind for ourselves.

Worship is our response to God's redemptive and loving initiative actions of grace towards us and all people. When God's people gather for worship they are remembering what He has done for them. In worship we recall the event that inscribed salvation on our hearts. We remember the death of Christ so that it may have an effect on us. Our worship should also be anticipatory as we look forward to the time when the redeemed will sit down at the Marriage Feast in Heaven. Therefore, our worship should always reflect the truth of the resurrection and thus celebratory of the “new life” we have through Jesus Christ. Worship should also lead us toward service. It is Worship for Service! We should enter to worship, so that we can depart to serve.

Scripture shows that worship is important because it binds us to God and to each other as believers. God calls us to worship repeatedly, and that worship leads us into deeper relationships with Him and with the church. It is our fallen nature to turn away from the Creator and toward ourselves with less than good results. Worship is a test of our willingness to forsake self and turn, in gratitude and adoration, to God. Worship should always correct our inward focus. And because to lose oneself is to find oneself, the act of worship is supremely transforming. That is the transforming power of worship and it is something that every pastor wants to see in his or her congregation.

I look forward to the birth of new worship at Wallace and greeting you all at 10:15 a.m. every Sunday in the New Year that it might truly be the Year of Our Lord in 2011.

The Session will hold a Town Meeting following the Morning Worship Service on Sunday, January 30th. A Fiscal Report for the 6 months of July through December 2010 will be presented along with an up-dated Budget for the New Fiscal Year of 2011. Information about key events, programs, and items related to the Mission and Ministry of Wallace for 2011 will be shared. The Mission Budget and Projects for 2011 will be revealed. An up-date on staffing will be given. We hope you will plan to join us as we embark on a New Year of “Cultivating a Nurturing Community which extends Christ’s Peace to All.”

New Lounge Series

A new fellowship opportunity will unfold during the year 2011. Each month one or two gatherings will be held in the New Lounge to help connect the members and friends of Wallace. The first event was held for the 18-25 age group in December. The January Lounge Series will be for **Parents of Teens**. On Thursday, January 20th, parents of teen-agers are invited to gather and connect with other parents that are enjoying the challenges of raising self-sufficient teens in a self-indulgent culture. Refreshments will be available beginning at 7:00 p.m. and informal conversation will be the format for the gathering. Watch in February for a Lounge Series Gathering for Newlyweds. Pastor Molnar will be hosting members and friends of Wallace who have been married 5 years or less.

A grandson of Ed and Marion Cunningham has begun a Mission Service Assignment within the country of Nicaragua. Scott Cunningham, his wife, and their two daughters began this new endeavor in service to the Lord in October. They recently sent their first report and Christmas greetings.

“Stewardship to Use Our Resources”

Did You Know?

- The first Lounge Series event was held on Tuesday, December 21, in the New Lounge. Two acoustic guitarists and singers entertained a crowd of about 50 18 – 25 year olds in what was called “A College Christmas.” Beverages and goodies were shared for a couple of hours as this age group connected with some good music and fellowship.
- We received a \$6,000 contribution to the Endowment Fund. An up-dated report on the Endowment Investments will be shared as part of the Town Meeting on Sunday, January 30 following worship.
- We received over \$350 towards a Matching Grant Challenge of \$750 in December. We hope to complete the challenge in January so that the funds can be disbursed.
- We have received over \$1,000 towards the Matching Grant of \$2,000 for Personal Assistance Projects. Some of these funds were released to help provide some support for individuals and families related to our Wallace Family during the Christmas Season.
- We had over 280 people including over 35 children at our Early Service on Christmas Eve.
- We had over 150 people at the Late Service on Christmas Eve to worship the birth of the Christ Child with the Chancel Choir and Orchestra.
- We received about \$300,000 in pledges to help support our \$400,000 budget for the up-coming fiscal year for ministry and mission expenses. If you have not returned your pledge card, you can still obtain one from the Church Office.
- Offering Envelopes for 2011 were disbursed following worship during the last few weeks of December. If you do not receive your offering envelopes by the second week of January, please contact the Church Office.

- **3th-4th grade** (202) During January their curriculum focuses on Epiphany, the flight to Egypt and the Jesus at the temple as a child. This class, as of Dec. 12, has \$220.01 towards the \$500 needed to buy a heifer through Heifer, International.
- **Kids' Class: Primary** PreK-2nd grade (201) will learn about the prophet Elijah This class is working on providing a sheep for a family (\$120) as of Dec. 12: \$110.26
- **Childcare** (room 101) is for children birth through age three so that their parents may attend an adult education class. Krista Kahler provides consistent care.

Details:

- Entries must be original art works—no kits or works done under instruction.
- Wall-hung works must be suitably framed. Free-standing work must be ready for display.
- We welcome works in diverse media to the extent that the display space can accommodate them.
- **There will be four "Juror's Choice Awards" of \$100 each, selected on the basis of the artistry of the work and interpretation of the theme. To be considered for a Juror's Choice Award, the work must be accompanied by a brief statement (150 words or less) telling how the work reflects the theme, to be read by the juror only.**
- On Friday, March 18, Professor Douglas will offer a critique of the exhibition with special focus on the pieces receiving the Juror's Choice Awards at 7 PM.
- Voting by exhibition viewers will determine the winner of a "People's Choice Award" (ribbon only).
- Art is to be dropped off at Wallace Memorial Presbyterian Church on Thursday, March 17 between 2 PM-7 PM.
- Art is to be picked up Wednesday, March 22 between 2 PM-7 PM.
- Adjunct activities during the exhibition will include demonstrations and performances.
- The Exhibition will be open to the public 6-8 PM Friday, March 18. Saturday, March 19, through Tuesday, March 22, the Exhibition will be open to the public 2-4 PM and 6-8 PM.
- Limit is 2 entries per artist; fee is \$15 per artist.
- Children 15 and younger may submit 1 framed, titled piece for a fee of \$5, for viewing only, not eligible for Juror's Choice Awards. Artwork should reflect a Bible story.

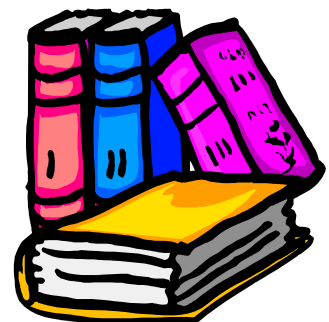
