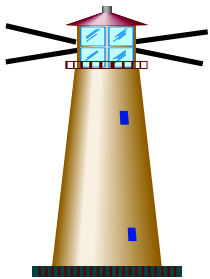

**NEW ORGANIST JOINS LEADERSHIP TEAM AT WALLACE**

**Richard Moser** has been selected to be our new organist by the Organist Search Committee. His selection was approved by the Session at their January 24 meeting, and Mr. Moser began playing on January 30. Rich is a life-long full time church musician, serving as an organist, pianist, choir director, music teacher, drama director and concert organist. He is choosing to step into a part time position with us after having served most recently at Holy Trinity Church in Robinson. He holds a Bachelor of Music degree from the University of the Pacific as an organ major, and a Masters in Sacred Music from Gettysburg Seminary. Rich has taken choirs on tour throughout Europe, and has performed organ concerts while on tour there. He has served in Lutheran, Catholic and Presbyterian churches in the Pittsburgh area, and has founded several musical and dramatic organizations. We are fortunate to have found a person of Rich's experience, ability and sense of ministry. We thank God for continued guidance and faithfulness to the ministry at Wallace.

Juror: **Elizabeth "Betty" Asche Douglas, artist/educator**

Details:

- Entries must be original art works—no kits or works done under instruction.
- Wall-hung works must be suitably framed. Free-standing work must be ready for display.
- We welcome works in diverse media to the extent that the display space can accommodate them.
- **There will be four "Juror's Choice Awards" of \$100 each, selected on the basis of the artistry of the work and interpretation of the theme. To be considered for a Juror's Choice Award, the work must be accompanied by a brief statement (150 words or less) telling how the work reflects the theme, to be read by the juror only.**
- On Friday, March 18, Professor Douglas will offer a critique of the exhibition with special focus on the pieces receiving the Juror's Choice Awards at 7 PM.
- Voting by exhibition viewers will determine the winner of a "People's Choice Award" (ribbon only).
- Art is to be dropped off at Wallace Memorial Presbyterian Church on Thursday, March 17 between 2PM-7PM.
- Art is to be picked up Wednesday, March 22 between 2 PM-7PM.
- Adjunct activities during the exhibition will include demonstrations and performances.
- The Exhibition will be open to the public 6-8 PM Friday, March 18. Saturday, March 19, through Tuesday, March 22, the Exhibition will be open to the public 2-4 PM and 6-8 PM.
- Limit is 2 entries per artist; fee is \$15 per artist.
- Children 15 and younger may submit 1 framed, titled piece for a fee of \$5, for viewing only, not eligible for Juror's Choice Awards. Artwork should reflect a Bible story.

# MISSIONS . . .

Our Mission Team has been highlighting Presbyterian mission workers around the world. This month we focus on our own members who are doing special mission projects in places of need in the world.

## **Jan Esterly with Surgicorps in Bhutan**

“Surgicorps International performs medical and surgical mission trips to countries in Asia, Africa and Central America. In April I will travel to Bhutan to assist with this group. Bhutan is a small landlocked country in South Asia, located at the eastern end of the Himalayas and bordered to the south, east and west by India and to the north by China. Many of the families will travel for two days by bus and then walk through the mountains to reach the hospital site. We will perform a variety of surgeries - many cleft lip and palate surgeries as well as other plastic surgeries for burn victims. These are life-changing surgeries which give these children and their families the gift of a better life. *A smile speaks in every language.*”

## **Craig Esterly with Rotary in Haiti**

“...Many of the health problems (in Haiti) can be linked to a lack of clean water...In the last few months alone over 3000 Haitians have died from cholera....Local Rotarians are now in the process of funding and directing the distribution of a very simple water filter for household use in Haiti. The filter, a locally made ceramic pot laced with a silver compound, has a proven track record of rendering tainted water safe to consume by filtering or destroying harmful contaminants.

...Rotary is raising funds to procure 1000 filters at a unit cost of US \$30 from the newly completed filter plant in Haiti for immediate disaster relief. Each filter can provide 1-2 liters of drinking water per hour for a family for a period of about 5 years.

...I have personally been involved in this project, having been on site in Honduras and Haiti., and have seen first hand the success of this program.”

## **Bill and Kay Heidkamp - New Orleans**

“In 2008 Wallace Church was sending a crew of eight people to New Orleans to help build/rebuild homes. My wife was enthusiastic and had booked her flight; I was a reluctant participant! And we had a wonderfully fulfilling experience in NOLA. We worked hard and learned a lot about the area...and we actually built houses!

Two years later we joined Kay’s brother’s church who also went to rebuild houses. This trip was sponsored by Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, a part of One Great Hour of Sharing. We helped rebuild a home damaged by Katrina. We met the owner and her family. We also met other crews from churches all over, some making their second and third trips.

We’re going back! Why? The real answer is, ‘You won’t know until you go...and once you go you are hooked!’ There are many rewards, one of which is seeing the people who will benefit from what you do. There’s still much to be done!”

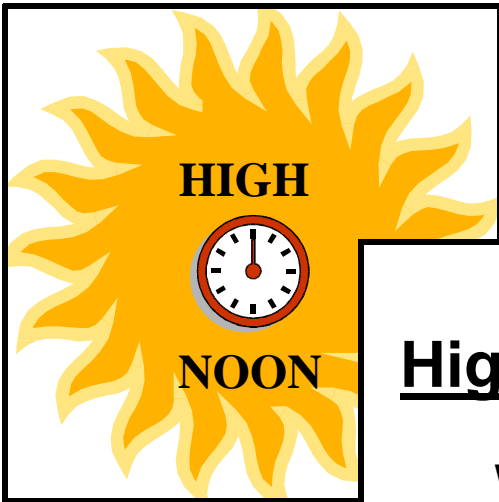
