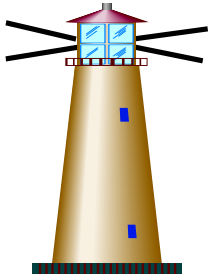

**Greater Pittsburgh Community Food Bank
Celebrates 30th Anniversary**

Our Wallace Food Pantry is a member of the Greater Pittsburgh Community Food Bank, which this year celebrates its 30th anniversary of operation. Currently boasting a network of over 380 members in 11 counties of Southwest Pennsylvania, the Food Bank uses solicitation, fund raising, special events, and community partnerships to gather food at its 94,000 square foot warehouse in Duquesne, PA. Through outlets such as soup kitchens, food pantries, shelters, after school programs, senior high rises, MH-MR drop-in centers, neighborhood food assistance agencies, emergency or disaster-related feeding sites, regional food banks, Meals on Wheels, community centers, and special programs, the Food Bank currently distributes around 21 million pounds of food per year.

The Food Bank is the source from which the Wallace Food Pantry secures about 75% of the food, paper products, and cleaning supplies that we distribute to our 150 registered client families. Each week, we pick up between 1,000 and 1,500 pounds of product from the Food Bank warehouse. Some of the food and other items Wallace receives are free because they come from the U.S. Department of Agriculture or from donations made to the Food Bank. Most items come at a nominal cost--far less than what would be spent on the same items at community grocery stores or discount warehouses. Contributions made by Wallace members on Food Pantry Sunday {last Sunday of each month} and throughout the year support these purchases from the Food Bank and also enable us to purchase additional needed items that cannot be secured through the Food Bank elsewhere in the community.

The connection between the Food Bank and Wallace's food pantry does not end there, however. The Food Bank also provides regular educational and support meetings for our pantry volunteers, including training on food handling and safety, bi-annual day-long conferences, and other gatherings to up-date our volunteer staff on the latest information about how to best serve our clients. Dieticians from the Food Bank have visited our pantry on a number of occasions to provide classes on healthy food preparation for our clients, and our agency liaison from the Food Bank visits our pantry regularly to ensure that we are complying with all federal, state, and local standards of service and to consult with us about any questions or concerns we may have.

Tuesday, June 7, 2011 is Hunger Awareness Day, the Food Bank's 30th birthday, and the farewell celebration for retiring Food Bank co-founder and CEO Joyce Rothermel. To celebrate, the Food Bank is hosting an Open House at its Duquesne headquarters {1 N. Linden St, Duquesne, PA, 15110} from 4-7 PM that day. All interested members of the community are welcome; no RSVP is required. To honor Joyce's lifetime of service and to keep her extra-ordinary vision alive, the Food Bank has created the Joyce Rothermel Legacy Fund. Donations to this fund will keep the Food Bank strong, and help feed hungry Pennsylvania families for years to come. It was important to pay attention to the numbers in order to know when to initiate the play for the team. Numbers are an important part of our every day life and numerology is the study of numbers and how they influence our lives, especially as we use them to mark or count the things of our lives. I have been doing some numerology regarding my own life as of late.

On May 20, I marked my 55th Birthday. Now I am legally eligible for some discounts, although I would prefer they check my I.D. to see if I was of a legal age to drink. As I have marked this moment in the course of my journey of life, it has made me realize the need to value each year and the events that have marked that number in my life. My life is a culmination of years of growth and blessing. A #1 wife Terri + 5 wonderful children {Jason, Kelly, Kimberly, Renee, Philip} + 2 sons-in-heart {Brian and Dustin} + a daughter-in-heart {Ashley} + 2 grandsons {Bryce and Braylan} adds up to much more than I can ever measure. Looking back, I realize how full my life has been and how abundant God's love for me has been, "Far more than I could ever imagine," as the scripture states. It encourages me to look forward to what is ahead of me according to God's intention. Too often people evaluate their age by the physical quality of the body or the lost elements of life, {the minus factors} rather than by the things that God has done to bless them along the way through their life and what is ahead of those who know His hand is in the midst of their lives. "Therefore, we do not lose heart. Though outwardly we are wasting away, yet inwardly we are being renewed day by day. For our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all. So we fix our eyes, not on what is seen, but on what is unseen. During July and August, I will once again revisit that theme of sailing the Trinitarian waters of the Greater Pittsburgh Region for the mission of Jesus Christ, which I first used when I arrived at Wallace. We are disciples aboard His sailing ship through the often "troubling waters" as well as "calm waters" of the world, but with Jesus as the Master and Commander we sail the waters with confidence of purpose, knowing God will navigate the ship to touch the lives He calls us to touch in His name, that they may be added to the number of saved to the glory of His Kingdom.

What do the numbers of your life tell you about the journey you have been through to date? I believe our lives add up to far more than we can ever imagine when we mark them by God's intention rather than our own, especially when He multiplies our lives together to His glory!

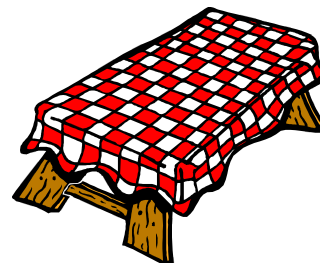
Annual Church Picnic

Excerpts from a letter from Bob and Kristi Rice in the Congo:

“We lurch along the dirt road on the way to West Kasai. We notice some palm branches stuck in the ground on the side of the road – a clear sign of welcome to expected visitors. Then we see several people standing in the road, waving. As we approach the village, we hear whoops and yells, and a man approaches the vehicle, dancing passionately. We say to the excited villagers that we will meet them at the church. The car is immediately surrounded by people, and we realize that we have no choice but to get out and walk. The procession to the church feels somewhat like a parade – we shake hands as we walk; the excitement is electrifying. The yells and singing are deafening and the dancing and movement almost too much to take in. A traditional warrior-dancer welcomes us with vigorous dancing!”

“We have come to Kasai to live and work with our Congolese brothers and sisters. Our presence is a tangible symbol for them that they are not alone. We know that the good news Jesus proclaimed transforms lives and brings freedom. We work alongside the CPC, seeking to strengthen the church in depth and reach. We are encouraged by glimpses of how God is at work, even though sometimes it takes extra effort for us to untangle the vast cultural differences and physical challenges.”

“Pastor Mboyamba told us that because travel is so difficult in Kasai, the rural churches often feel forgotten. A visit from leaders in the church and foreign missionaries is a significant boost to their spirits. After our visit, there will probably be a surge in church attendance as others in the village are impressed at the value shown to the parish community.”

“It is hard to see the churches with crumbling walls or the classrooms that do not have roofs. When the poverty is so severe, it is hard to know how to encourage the parish communities while also challenging them to creatively use local resources.”

“God cares about the Congolese and grieves at the physical suffering here. We, too, look forward with anticipation to how God wants to grow His church in the Congo.”
