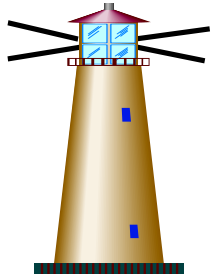

“The Peace of The Lord”

*“Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you.
I do not give to you as the world gives.
Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid.”
- John 14: 27 -*

Where were you on 9/11 a decade ago? I had just left to lead a Bible Study at an apartment of a church member in Butler, and the word on the television report was that “apparently a small aircraft had hit one of the twin towers in New York.” When we turned on the report at the member’s apartment, the whole world was in shock. The twin towers tumbled, a plane crashed outside Shanksville, Pennsylvania, the Pentagon was in flames, and our world was shaken beyond our understanding! Since then the words “terror, fear, inspection, suspicion, and war” have become daily words on people’s lips. We have established a government agency called Homeland Security and we now have airport lines with the TSA agents frisking, inspecting, and x-raying every element of our beings. We continue to be engaged in two war zones and the world view has been significantly altered. Privacy issues and personal information threats are on everyone’s concern lists and we continue to be rocked by economic uncertainty. We are not at “peace”!

I remember holding a special prayer vigil the night after 9/11 and the Sanctuary was full of anxious people and the Sanctuary was well filled the following Sunday and for several months later. The unease was thick and adjustments to our lifestyle have continued to reflect this unease. Many people have been looking to others to blame and we have at times targeted whole groups of people with a broad brush of “quick judgment”. We are suspicious of the stranger and distrust has invaded many elements of our relationships with others. The world is not at peace and this is not the peace the Lord intends for our lives.

During the month of September we will examine and experience the peace Jesus promised to His disciples on the night He shared the Last Supper before He was betrayed and crucified. In a variety of ways the age we live in is an echo of the unease I am sure the disciples felt when their world was shaken by the crucifixion. The promise of peace became a reality for the disciples with the resurrection and with the gift of the Holy Spirit, even though the world continued to be rocked by turmoil and uncertainty through the ages. It is this same Spirit that we need to look for in this age of uncertainty and unease. It is a gift that we receive in our baptism and is activated as we live life as part of the Kingdom of Jesus Christ in this world. We need to discover how to breathe this Spirit in again and learn how to share it with the communities we are part of in the world.

This effort will begin with sharing the gospel with one another through the Education Hour Offerings being launched on September 11. Consider that many of the children we will be teaching were toddlers or unborn when 9/11 first happened and need to know the love of the Lord Jesus in a world that is so “topsy-turvy”. There will be other opportunities to share the peace of Christ with one another, including the worship services, as we hold a Service of Shalom (Hebrew word for Peace) on 9/11. We will celebrate the Sacrament of Communion and share fellowship with one another at a Brunch on 9/18. The Sacrament of Baptism will be celebrated on 9/25 helping us to remember this promise of peace the Lord intends for all to receive. Please explore the pages of this issue of the Tower Light to see what offerings of peace you can participate in during the month ahead, especially some of the new offerings like Tuesdays 4 Families, Conversations About..., Tea & Tales, and the Comfort Group. I urge you to be a part of building up the peace of Christ in your own life and learn to share the peace Christ intended for us all as a community of disciples in this age of unease.

Please remember that our calling is to be agents of peace through the mission of the church, especially as we fulfill our Mission Statement:

“Cultivating a Nurturing Community which extends Christ’s Peace to All”

2011 PEACEMAKING OFFERING

World Communion Sunday
October 02

*"A harvest of justice is sown in peace."
{James 3: 18}*

The Presbyterian Peacemaking Offering supports the efforts of Presbyterians through their congregations, presbyteries, synods, and the General Assembly to work for peace by tearing down walls that divide. The day recommended for congregations to receive the Offering is World Communion Sunday, which is a celebration of the unity of the world-wide church through Christ. Christians in congregations around the world participate in the Lord's Supper.

Gifts to the Offering are used in a variety of peacemaking efforts at all levels of the Presbyterian Church {U.S.A.}.

- 25% is retained by congregations
- 25% is used by presbyteries and synods
- 50% is allocated to General Assembly ministries

In 2010 nearly \$2 million was received through the Peacemaking Offering. Fund-raising expenses amounted to \$211,584, which includes a contribution to shared mission support of \$49,548 and \$162,036 for producing resources and promoting the Offering.

Christian Education/Spiritual Formation

We listened at the Sankofa Gathering last Spring and have adapted some changes into our Sunday Education Hour. Classes start again on September 11, 9:00-10:00.

Changes to note: **We have grouped our children and youth differently.**

- There will be a **High School Class** geared for 9th-12 grades. - Then our new **Intermediate Class** will include 3-4-5 grades.
We also hope to have an e-mail go weekly from the teaching team to the parents to keep you informed on what is being studied in class.
- Two room changes for adult classes: The adult **Short Class** is moving to the Conference Room while the **Connections Class** is moving to 204.
