



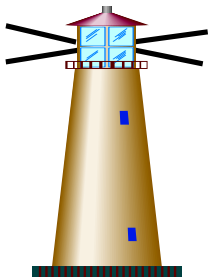

For the last several months we have been sending packages to a deployed army unit to Afghanistan.

Jeremy Butler, is the husband of Pastor Dennis and Terri Molnar's niece Michelle. She has sent the following information:

Jeremy had a "second close call" last week when his vehicle hit a road-side bomb. All the tires were flattened and several items were blown off the vehicle. Only minor scrapes and bruises resulted. Jeremy will be receiving a Purple Heart for the concussion injury sustained in the first incident several months ago. Ryan Blough and Joshua Gissendaner have returned to the U.S. as a result of injuries sustained several weeks ago. The unit continues to consist of about 38 guys and will be deployed for another 6 months or more.

On the good news front, "Krueger" became a father for the first time when his son, Easton, was born on August 20. Both mother and son are doing fine. "Krueger was able to come home on a quick leave to see his wife and baby before returning to the unit.

Please continue to write notes and cards of encouragement. They sometimes feel at a distance and forgotten.

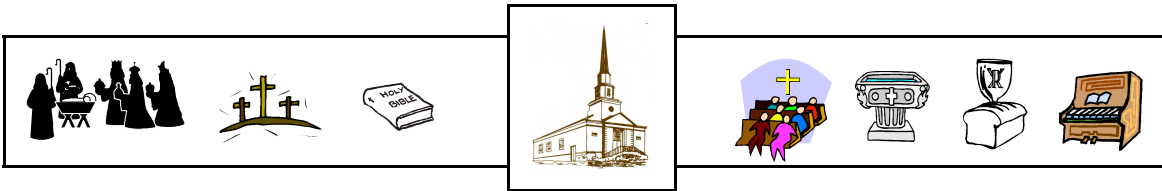

We will follow the worship service with a **Harvest Luncheon**, hosted by the Elders of Wallace, in Fellowship Hall. During the luncheon we will be asking you to voice some of your thoughts about how we can shape the future ministry and mission of Wallace. **Please join us on this important day!**

Cultivating a Harvest of Righteousness

When I was growing up as a young teen I spent a lot of time with my grandfather and grandmother on week-ends and on Summer days. They lived in a small house where they both tended to the needs of a wealthy family. My grandmother was the cleaning lady and did the laundry. My grandfather was the care-taker of the property that included a small lake with a bath-house and pavilion, a pond, a winding stream, a large wooded area, several acres of lawn, a chicken coop, a large garden, and the main house. He was responsible for all the lawn care, landscaping, equipment maintenance, gardening, and house maintenance. He was a "jack of all trades" having worked on oil rigs in Harmony and as a primary farm worker of Treesdale Farms and Orchards, where my mother grew up. {It is now a large housing plan in the Pine-Richland area.}

That was where I spent many hours helping to mow, feed chickens, ride on the tractor, haul wood, row the boat on the lake to fish, prune bushes, sickle and trim grass, hand off tools to the mechanic, and tend to the large garden. It was while I was helping my grandfather that I learned about not only working hard but about the values of life that have been instrumental in nurturing my soul. As I would share a task with him, or when we would pause for a cold "pop" and baked goodie, he would share his wisdom through story-telling or offer a "pearl of insight" that was full of truth. He did a lot of soul-tending in the hearts of all his children, grandchildren and the extended family as we would gather for meals or fun activities at the property. The owners let our family make use of the lake, the pond, and other amenities as long as they were not hosting family and friends. I have many fond memories of swimming in the lake, catching crawfish in the creek, fishing on the small lake, ice skating on the pond, playing hockey on the frozen lake, playing hide-n-seek in the woods, and just having fun after the work was done. A great deal of my character was formed through time spent with grandparents, family members, and siblings at that place.

I remember many hours of time shared in the garden with my grandfather where he taught me about cultivating the soil, seeding the soil, tending the plants, weeding properly, and enjoying the harvest. During the months of October and November I am going to be interpreting some of the seed and harvest parables of Jesus using the lens of my grandfather's teachings in the garden, as well as other resources. It wasn't just the harvest of fruit and vegetables that was joyous through those years. More importantly, it was the harvest of righteousness that was seeded in my soul by my grandfather that is still feeding my soul. The older I get the more grateful I am for the seeds planted back then in my early years that are still producing a harvest of wonder and delight in and through my life. As I pastor in the Fields of Harvest for the Lord, I continue to cultivate the soil of souls so that the good seed of His Spirit can grow and prosper in the lives of those we plant the Word and love of the Lord within.

This has especially become more important the more I see the truth of Jesus' words, "The harvest is plentiful but the laborers are few." I see a harvest ripe for the Lord in the Greater Pittsburgh Region, within the communities of Green Tree, Scott Township, Mount Washington, Rosslyn Farms, Carnegie, Dormont, Mount Washington, and beyond, yet we have fewer committed disciples to till the soil of those fields. I am also aware of the lack of resources we are investing in seeding and tilling of those souls, because of what we do with harvest of prosperity we have reaped in the past and are unsure of in the future. We need to renew our efforts to till the fields, seed the souls, weed the growing plants, cultivate the soil, and prepare for a plentiful harvest for the Lord in this place he has claimed for the Kingdom.

We are called to labor in the fields for the Lord's Kingdom to produce a harvest of righteousness that can impact the lives of a multitude! I will continue to engage in that endeavor with the faithful at Wallace. I hope you will join me in worship, fellowship, education, mission, and stewardship during the next several months as we continue to "cultivate a nurturing community which extends Christ's peace to all." It is our call in this place! Therefore, I will be cultivating the seeds of His love in all of our souls this Fall, that we may all produce a harvest of righteousness to the glory of God.

October 9, 16, 23 & 30 "A Fresh Look at the Apostles' Creed" with Betty Eichler. These sessions will be based on the book, "In Search of Belief" by Sister Joan Chittister, a Benedictine Nun living in a Convent in Erie, PA. She is a social psychologist and an outspoken advocate for the rights of women, especially in leadership in the Church. She asks such questions as, "What are we to believe in an age when everything that was certain a few decades ago is no longer considered factual?" "What is belief, anyway?" "Should anyone believe anything that isn't self-evident?" "Is it any longer credible to believe in faith, to have faith in belief?" and, "Is creed even possible now?" She challenges us to understand the Apostles' Creed from a new perspective.
